### A CORRECTION.

*To the Editor:*

In your issue of the 22d of December, I find a paragraph relative to the standing of the colony at Cotopaxi, Colorado. I think that the report contained therein is in some measure exaggerated. The colonists have only one team together, and though they earn money, but their wages do not amount to \$3 and 50¢ a day. Not all of them have cows, and their houses are not furnished too luxuriously. However, they will get along and work out their own salvation, if they will be let alone, and thereby taught that it is now incumbent on them to support themselves and their families. Most of them have got more or less money, and the Colony will always stand forth as a monument of Jewish charity, and as a proof of the agricultural capacities of our coreligionists. A few amongst them may not justify our expectations, but the majority of the colonists are and will remain good farmers. Yours very Respectfully,
