
COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

The Board Meets and Acts on Several Matters.

The county board met yesterday afternoon and made several changes in the boundaries of election precincts in accordance with the recommendations of County Attorney Mills. The changes affect four precincts only—the ninth, twenty-second, twenty-ninth and forty-fifth. A new precinct, called the thirty-eighth, was taken from precinct nine and another, numbered forty-three, taken from the twenty-seventh, twenty-ninth and forty-fifth precincts. This will change the numbering of the precincts outside the city. The old thirty-eighth will number thirty-nine, thirty-nine will be forty, forty will be forty-one, forty-one will be forty-two, forty-two will be forty-four, forty-three will be forty-five, forty-five will be forty-six, etc. Avery Gallup, Lewis Yorke and J. S. Van Dusen have been appointed judges of the new thirty-eighth and Philip Klafabr, Emil Reimann and Charles Schweikart judges of the new forty-third.

Some time ago a colony of Jewish refugees from Russia was formed at 'Cropsy' in Fremont county by a man named Sawtelle. For some reason the colony which numbers about 100 has not proved a success and the colonists have been living to a great extent on the charity of the people in the neighborhood. Yesterday application was made to the county commissioners by three of them to be sent to Lincoln Neb. The commissioners not thinking that Arapshoe county extended to Fremont county thought the application a little fresh and refused it.
